Keynote Speaker: Dr. Dwight E. Adams research team developing DNA techniques first

Director, Forensic Science Institute University of Central Oklahoma

Prior to becoming the first director of the Forensic Scientific Institute in 2006, Dr. Adams served 23 years with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in Quantico, Virginia, as Director of the FBI Laboratory. During his FBI tenure, he served as a member of the FBI



used in 1988. He has testified as a DNA expert over 130 times, aided in the creation of the National DNA Database, and has been responsible for solving or aiding more than 100,000 cases nationwide. In 2003, he was the recipient of the Presidential Rank Award as Distinguished Executive, the highest award presented in the federal government.
